

## Chapter News

Update on Dr. Judith B. Carlson Limited Endowment

Betty Marshall, Treasurer, NC DKG, just sent this to Alpha Gamma: "This is an update on the above named fund for 2020.

A \$10,000 Certificate of Deposit was opened on January 7.

A total of \$1,645 in donations were made to the Fund during the year.

In addition to the \$10,000 CD, the Fund currently has \$2,193.97 in checking.

Funds are now available for the next cycle of grants."

This will be a topic for business at our February meeting. In looking at our committee structure, both the Education Foundation Committee and the Awards Committee have duties which impact this. We will need to decide if the two committees will work jointly on this or which committee should take on this project...determining the process for submission and selection for the next cycle of grants. It's great to be at this point!

## Book Discussion: Born a Crime February 25 5:00 pm

This is a gentle reminder of the book discussion of Trevor Noah's book, <u>Born a Crime</u>, so you have time to get and read it...if you haven't already. Remember this will be a Zoom meeting held jointly with our mentor chapter, Alpha Phi (Asheville) on Thursday evening, February 25 at \*5:00. The Watauga library is currently closed, but folks can either call in or order online to borrow books and have curb-side pickup. Also <u>Born A Crime</u> was on last year's high school Battle of the Books list, so the high school libraries will have multiple copies of the abridged version, which is essentially the same minus the curse words. You should be able to borrow one of those by asking their high school librarian.

#### Strategies to Recruit New and/or Regain Dropped Members

Recruiting new members and/or dropped members continues to be a strong focus for Alpha Gamma. Our State President, Dr. Teresa Cowan, and our new Region IX Director, Susan Blackburn, presented ideas for increasing membership and participation at our first two fall meetings. This year Alpha Gamma grew by adding 12 new members and reinstating 6! Our membership committee solicits names of potential members from the entire Alpha Gamma membership. The membership chairperson, Susan Phipps, holds an orientation for potential members who are also invited to attend one or two meetings as our guests to see how we function. We also share recent newsletters with these candidates. Attempts are made to have more than one member in each school and in each content area to increase access and collaboration. We evaluate our list of members by age ranges and actively seek new members in the 20-40 year old range...where we now have 11 members. This is up from 3 last year. We actively address public relations by getting the name of our organization in front of teachers and community members. Newsletters, local media, school board meetings, convocations, blood drives, Hospitality House dinners, Duke Endowment Summer Literacy Program, and the Blue Ridge Relay are some of the more direct avenues used to publicize our work. We give door prizes of school supplies collected throughout the year at both Avery's and Watauga's beginning of year convocation meetings. We actively participate in the state's Beginning Educators Excelling (BEE) recognition program by presenting certificates, placing the recognitions in our newsletters and local newspaper, and recognizing recipients at a school board meeting. We actively research for programs which will be especially appreciated by younger members. Our hybrid meetings have the unexpected plus of making it easier for younger teachers who have children to participate from home.

## Duke Endowment Summer Literacy Program Boone United Methodist Church

Carol Deal and Brenda Reese are actively involved in the planning process for the third summer of the Summer Literacy Program funded by the Duke Endowment. Boone United Methodist Church is the site where fourty rising first, second, and third graders will receive intensive reading instruction as well as enrichment activities from June 14 through July 22.

Volunteers from Alpha Gamma's ranks are welcomed with open arms. This program is one of the local projects Alpha Gamma actively supports.

Volunteer sign up sheets will be available, hopefully, by our April meeting.


Watauga's Beginning Teachers Excelling BEE Awards
