

## **DKG International Educators Foundation Benefits Teachers**

The DKG International Educators Foundation (DKGIEF) was established earlier this year when the DKG Educational Foundation and the DKG Supporting Corporation merged. Its mission is to support effective educational projects, the educational and charitable activities of The Delta Kappa Gamma Society International, and professional growth of educators worldwide.

Each month, *Eta Data's* calendar lists due dates for upcoming applications that DKG members may apply for, such as the Cornetet Awards for individual professional development or seminars or DKG Scholarships. These fall under the DKGIEF, as do World Fellowship, Emergency Fund, and others.

Now is the time for members to begin preparing applications that will be due February 1 for as many as 31 scholarships available for those pursuing advanced degrees. Scholarships for those seeking other graduate studies are \$6,000 and a doctorate is \$10,000. Applications are currently available on the Society website under the Apply/Submit tab-Applications.

Dr. Judith Carlson, an NC DKG past state president and past chair of the NC DKG Educational Foundation, was elected to the DKGIEF Board of Directors this summer. Judith says, "The Board has met and we are fully engaged in visions of fund-raising and of awarding funds to worthy proposals that will impact education, teachers and learners. # Growing as a Professional Educator

MEET AMANDA GRINDSTAFF NEW ASSISTANT PRINCIPAL AT CRANBERRY MIDDLE SCHOOL

My name is Amanda Grindstaff and I have been involved with Avery County Schools in some way since 1982. In 1982, my Dad started working for School Maintenance when I was three years old. I grew up hearing about boilers and water systems. I knew if the heat didn't work at Avery High that the system would call my Dad. I also knew if I were to get in trouble at school, I was sunk because Daddy was always around somewhere. I have spent my entire school career in Avery County from the time I started kindergarten until I graduated with an administrative



certificate. What I did as far as graduate courses were completed through Appalachian State online. Needless to say, this is my home and my people. My great grandparents were educators in Avery County. She taught, and he was a principal. He started the first lunch program at Riverside Elementary. They inspired me to become an educator.

My actual first job with Avery County Schools was mowing. I mowed one summer, and the next summer I worked in the personnel office as the secretary. I put in CEUs and made interview appointments. My first teaching position came immediately after I graduated from Lees McRae. I started at Banner Elk Elementary as an assistant in a K-2 combination class. After 8 days, I took an interim position at Riverside Elementary teaching art and technology. The following year I taught PE and weightlifting at Avery High for one semester. I finished the year at Freedom Trail teaching Pre-K. I then moved to Newland Elementary where the next few years were quite interesting. I taught a 1-2 combination, 3 years of kindergarten, 2 years of second, 1 year of 4th, another year of second, 7 more years of kindergarten and finished my teaching in 4th grade again. I enjoyed teaching.

I started back to school at Appalachian State in 2013. Our school system offered the deal of a lifetime. They told us if we would agree to enroll in the Reading Specialist certification program, they would pay for it. They also said beyond that, if we would complete the masters part of that program, they would pay for half of that as well. Needless to say, I have a Reading Specialist Certification and a masters in reading--graduating in 2016. On my own, I began the administration program in 2017. I want my doctorate, but in curriculum and instruction. I decided that I would go through with the administration part of things to add that certificate. I graduated with my administration certificate in 2018 after completing it in a year and a half. I will complete my doctorate at some point, but, currently, I am enjoying not being in school.

My new job is assistant principal at Cranberry Middle School. Like many people, I put in for this job because I didn't know who would be placed at the school where I worked. When they called me about the job, I was asked if I could choose, which school I would want and why. I chose Cranberry because the Cranberry community has so many people I know from the community--church, family, and friends. I felt like I had been offered a ride home.

When I showed up on the first day of work, I knew I was home. I feel very blessed. Part of my inspiration comes from others in my family that quit school because of a bad experience. I determined early on that no matter what, I would never let a kid know that I didn't like them. I have always seen it as a challenge to pick the meanest, hardest one to work with and try to find a way to connect. I have had issues with them a time or two but for the most part it's worked. Kids that no one else can get along with have been some of the best ones I've had.
