

International Achievement Award Winner

Each year a member of DKG is recognized for her distinguished contributions to the International level of the Society. A surprise telephone call to Dr. Helen Popovich, the current international parliamentarian--with a Zoom meeting--named her the 2020 International Achievement Award recipient. She has been active in DKG since 1960, serving at various levels in four of the five DKG regions as she moved around the country. She has taught English at the school and university levels as well as served as the president of two different universities. The recipient receives a gold medallion and chain to be worn only by those receiving the honor.

Two recent recipients from North Carolina are Dr. Barbara Day, a past International president, and Dr. Gwen Simmons who served as the International parliamentarian.

Alpha Gamma Summer Literacy Project

ALPHA GAMMA Chapter (Region IX, Watauga & Avery) Vice-President Adele Byrd is the morning site director for the Summer Literacy Project at Boone United Methodist Church. Sponsored by the Duke Endowment, this three year project provides a summer literacy program to rising first- and second grade students in Watauga County. The program implemented remote learning for 2020 due to COVID-19.

Carol Deal, Ebbie Hendrick, and Brenda Reese have been deeply involved with the planning process since the first year of the program's inception. Alpha Gamma plans to continue this as a project next year with hopes to discover a way to sustain the program for additional years.

Education Foundation Grants

NC DKG has several Endowment Grants due on September 30. Alpha Gamma was fortunate to have several grants funded last year. The application process is relatively simple.



Alpha Gamma highly encourages its members to go to ncdkgef.org for specific details. Grant applications are due **September 30.** Fortunately, the application process is easy. Alpha Gamma was fortunate to have several winners in last fall's grant cycle! Here is an overview of the grant information *taken directly from the Description of Grants on the website.*

The North Carolina Delta Kappa Gamma Educational Foundation has identified four categories of grants to individuals and to Delta Kappa Gamma chapters submitting proposals dealing with the professional and personal growth of women educators and/or raising the bar on excellence in learning

potential to meet a broad range of educational needs in classroom, school, and community settings to benefit all racial, ethnic, and age groups, members and non-members of Delta Kappa Gamma, male and female educators and students. Only proposals that meet all requirements of Section 501(c)(3) of the tax code will be considered.

Grants are awarded annually, with the timeline for applications and notification of recipients announced at the Foundation's Annual Meeting. For 2020-2021 the Foundation is offering grants ONLY from categories #2 and #4 in amounts up to \$500.

2. Continuing Education for Professional/Personal Growth

These grants are awarded to individuals or to projects offering professional or personal growth for women educators pursuing career advancement or personal growth through such educational activities as attendance at conferences or seminars, participation in independent study, educational travel, etc. These grants will be available to active or retired educators who give evidence of how the proposed experience will be used for educational purposes in a classroom, school, or community setting.

4. Advancement of Learning and/or Literacy in a Classroom, School, or Community Setting This project grant, which may be initiated by Delta Kappa Gamma chapters or individual educators, covers a broad range of possibilities, as it focuses directly on meeting an immediate need that will enhance learning or literacy for students in classroom, school, or community settings.

Information on Virtual Platforms


How to Use Zoom to Communicate *Sherri Hale*

Zoom is a video conferencing platform that many businesses and schools are using to conduct meetings and classes. Zoom has it's own website with answers to many of the questions you might have, but here are a few things you should know.

- Zoom can be used on desktops, laptops, Macs, chromebooks, and mobile phones. You just need the appropriate software for your device (found at the link above), and a webcam and microphone if your device doesn't have them built in.
- You will receive a link to the Zoom meeting before the meeting starts.
- You can start your own meetings. The free plan allows you to host up to 100 participants in a meeting for 40 minutes at a time.
